HEATON PARK ANIMAL CENTRE

MANCHESTER MUSEUM

The Manchester Museum is on Oxford Road with the University of Manchester in the City Centre. There are plenty of exhibitions and going on at the Museum regularly, from Dinosaurs to Golden Mummies of Egypt. Entry to the museum and most exhibitions are free, some require pre-booking, some of the upcoming events include:

• Autumn Workshops - 24th - 27th October Free for families, drop in between 2-4pm for creative activities

• Windrush stories - 28th October, 11am-12pm A storytelling workshop for families with children aged 5 and up. Free, booking required.

• Diwali at the Museum - 11th November, day, and evening Free for everyone to learn about and get involved with Diwali celebrations.
