Main barriers to education that have been identified

At St Dunstan's RC Primary School, the following barriers to educational achievement for pupils in receipt of the Pupil Premium have been identified:

- Poor attendance & punctuality
- Lack of emotional well-being -pupils with specific social and emotional needs which affect their learning
- Lack of concentration during morning lessons through hunger
- Lack of support for learning at home
- Lack of access to extra -curricular activities – Enriching experiences such as educational visits and workshops
